







Watowan River Bike Route Animal Scouting

	<p>White-tailed deer can be seen jumping through fields, especially if exploring at dusk.</p>		<p>Mourning doves can be seen sitting on power lines, or heard by their distinctive call: "ooAHHH cool coo coo."</p>
	<p>Milkweed is the plant monarch lay eggs on, where there's milkweed there are monarch butterflies!</p>		<p>Killdeer make their nests near drainage ditches. They're named after their common call "kill-deer."</p>
	<p>Red-winged blackbirds and the female brown-winged, brown birds, live along watery ditches and make a "chirp" call.</p>		<p>The illustrious pheasant lives in the grassy areas of ditches and Wildlife Preserves. They usually hide, but sometimes can be seen running through fields or flying to safety.</p>
